# RED GABLES CAMPUS

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## Lower School Building

\$10,000,000

The new Lower School building will serve all students in grades K-5. This three-story building will consist of collaborative, grade-level commons areas surrounded by classrooms 40% larger than current classrooms, state-of-the-art science labs, and interactive MakerSpaces.

## Loop Road

\$2,500,000

The Loop Road will create a secure perimeter around the entire Lower/Middle School Campus, will allow for greater accessibility to the campus, and will provide a safer and more efficient hookup process.

## Track & Field *Reserved*

\$2,000,000

The Lower/Middle School Track & Field is used almost daily, year-round, primarily for physical education classes, athletic matches and practices. It is also the iconic setting for the time-honored tradition of Field Day.



## Quadrangle *Reserved*

\$1,500,000

Located in the heart of the Lower/Middle School Campus, the Quadrangle is a space that both students and faculty enjoy during daily break times. The quad also becomes a gathering space for families before and after community events such as Pancake Breakfast and Closing Exercises, and it is the site of the traditional Field Day pep rallies.

## Lower School Monumental Stair

\$1,000,000

The monumental stair will serve as a focal point and popular gathering spot for the Lower School building.

**Lower School World Languages Center** *Reserved* **\$1,000,000**  
The World Languages Center will provide two updated classrooms, offering a dedicated and immersive setting for language education.

**Patton Hall Commons**  
**\$1,000,000**  
This versatile commons space is located in Patton Hall, the academic building serving Ensworth's middle school students. The room is used as student lounge space, a gathering area for class and activity meetings, or a location for special parent meetings and events.



**Brown Athletic Center Performance Court**  
**\$1,000,000**  
In addition to hosting basketball practices, games, and leagues throughout the year, the Brown Athletic Center gymnasium is also used for beloved events such as spirit assemblies, Grandparents Day, Pancake Breakfast, and Closing Exercises.

**AfterCare Center** **\$1,000,000**  
The new AfterCare Center will be a hub of activity after three o'clock. Currently, more than 50 families utilize the AfterCare program each day, a number that is expected to continue to grow. The expanded space will also offer additional areas for after-school study and STEM programs.

**Lower School Grade Area Commons** **\$500,000**  
Grade Area Commons are available for each grade from K-5. The Commons will provide areas for collaboration between two or more classes and space for grade-level meetings and events.

**Playground** *Reserved* **\$500,000**  
Students in Grades K-5 enjoy daily outdoor activity on the Lower School playground, providing a necessary balance of work and play.

**Softball Field** **\$500,000**  
The softball field hosts all home, middle school softball competitions and is also used as an event location during the annual Field Day celebration.

**Admission Reception Area** *Reserved* **\$250,000**  
One of the first spaces on campus that prospective parents visit, the Admissions Reception Area provides a welcoming lounge for the admissions team to meet with families who are visiting the school.

### Lower School Science Labs *Reserved*

\$250,000 each

The third floor of the Lower School building and renovations to the current third grade wing will provide new modern science labs for students in grades K-5. The larger labs will allow for more sophisticated, multi-day experiments, and two of the labs have garage walls that open to the outdoors, providing opportunities for indoor/outdoor exploration.

### Culinary Teaching Space *Reserved*

\$250,000

The new Culinary Teaching Space will allow students to take their “veggiecation” to the next level. With a large prep area, sinks, and ovens, the kitchen is designed to help students learn more about food and nutrition as they perform edible experiments.

### Tiger Tunnel *Reserved*

\$250,000

Tiger Tunnel runs under the new Loop Road and connects the main campus to the track and field. Middle School athletes and Field Day participants process through the tunnel before games, and the space also includes team rooms, restrooms, and necessary storage for equipment.

### Private Dining Room *Reserved*

\$250,000

The newly-renovated Robinson Dining Hall includes a private dining area that can host smaller groups, providing much-needed additional meeting space on the Lower/Middle School Campus.

### Robinson Hall Terrace *Reserved*

\$250,000

The Robinson Hall terrace is a new addition to campus that was part of the dining hall renovations. The spacious terrace overlooks the Lower/Middle School quad and provides a lovely outdoor space for events.

### Lower School Office Suite

\$150,000

The Lower School construction will provide new office spaces for school administrators, counselors, and support staff that are adjacent to common areas for students, increasing visibility and accessibility.

### Lower School Classroom \$100,000 each

The new classroom spaces will be 40% larger than existing classrooms allowing for flexibility in classroom setup, for lessons and activities tailored to different learning styles, and for more space for students and their teachers to move as they work and learn together. All classrooms will feature interactive MakerSpaces and integrated technology.
